#### NHS staffing professionals feel overwhelmed and overlooked

Almost half of those working in NHS staffing roles are dissatisfied due to the crippling job pressures they face. Research from NHS Employers has found that 45% of people working in medical staffing face increased workloads and resource constraints, and often feel they are overlooked or their roles misunderstood.

#### Physicians Behaving Badly: Stress and Hardship Trigger Misconduct

Physicians are seeing more frequent incidents of other doctors acting disrespectfully toward patients or coworkers, not respecting patient privacy, and acting aggressively. Such behaviour is still relatively uncommon. Some physicians feel that the public holds them to an overly high standard for behaviour that has nothing to do with treating patients. Medscape surveyed more than 1500 doctors about how often and where physician misbehaviour crops up, and what they've witnessed with other doctors in recent years.
