New library catalogue and more books to borrow!



NHS Trust staff across Lincolnshire now have access to a wider range of books and other features with the new HeLM library catalogue.

Health Libraries in the Midlands (HeLM) is a consortium of regional NHS libraries that share a book catalogue and allow items to be loaned out to NHS staff across the East and West Midlands.

ULHT Library and Knowledge Services joined the consortium earlier this year and we have been working hard to implement the changes to our catalogue and book lending as quickly and as smoothly as possible.

The new **book catalogue** can be found at www.healthlibrariesmidlands.nhs.uk or using the QR code below. If you find a book that is available for loan from a library outside of Lincolnshire you can place a reservation and the book will be posted to your local ULHT library site for collection. We will continue to post books out to work address for staff working in the community.

You can borrow up to **16 books** at a time and most books can be borrowed for 6 weeks. Loans are automatically renewed five times unless an item has been reserved by another member of HeLM.

If you have borrowed books previously you should have received an email explaining the changes. You don't need to do anything if you're happy with these changes. If you are not currently registered to borrow books you can do so here:

Critically Appraising for Anti-Racism Toolkit

Racial bias in research impacts a study's relevancy, validity and reliability. At present this aspect is not addressed in critical appraisal tools, and consequently appraisers may often not take racial bias into account when assessing a paper's quality.

In response to this, a [supplementary tool](#) has been developed, to support appraisers in explicitly addressing racial bias. Cardiff University have also developed an [elearning tutorial](#) that aims to provide an awareness of the issues and consequences of underrepresentation of minoritised ethnic populations in research and of the difference between race and genetic ancestry and how this relates to research.
