NHS finance business rules from 2026/27: guidance for integrated care boards and NHS trusts

This guidance sets out the finance business rules for integrated care boards (ICBs) and NHS trusts and foundation trusts ('NHS trusts') that will apply from 1 April 2026. The finance business rules include relevant statutory financial duties and other financial policy requirements set by NHS England and the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) that apply to ICBs and NHS trusts, as well as setting out how the impact of surpluses and deficits are managed in future years. Funding & Financial Frameworks

Holding the NHS to account for wasteful use of resources

Countless column inches have been devoted to the issue of waste in the NHS, often focusing on apparently simple fixes that commentators suggest could save taxpayers' money (eg axing 'non-jobs' or cutting senior manager pay). But curiously, some of the biggest opportunities to improve value for money receive remarkably little attention either from the press or from government. See here.

The NHS budget and how it has changed

The vast majority of public NHS funding comes from general taxation and National Insurance contributions. A small proportion of funding (1% of the total Department of Health and Social Care budget in 2023/24) comes from patient charges for services such as prescriptions and dental treatment. The level of NHS funding in a









given year is set by central government through the Spending Review process and annual Budgets. See here.

This booklet brings together insights from four HFMA roundtables in which NHS leaders discussed the building blocks to value-based healthcare. The roundtables were held virtually between July and October 2025. Each was attended by around 12 participants from financial, clinical, analytical and research backgrounds. The topics were: waste (held in collaboration with the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges); data (with the Federation for Informatics Professionals in Health and Social Care); programme budgeting (with the Oxford Value and Stewardship Programme); and difficult decisions. Workforce & Staffing Costs

VAT liability of the supply of temporary medical staff

Following the first-tier tribunal decision in the Isle of Wight NHS Trust vs HM Revenue and Customs case, HMRC has issued guidance to anyone who wants to claim a refund. HMRC considers supplies of temporary staff by employment business to be taxable supplies of staff at the standard VAT rate. See here.
