State of the provider sector

The findings from this year's survey highlight a sector under sustained pressure yet demonstrating resilience and adaptability in the face of complex challenges. Trust leaders remain deeply concerned about winter pressures, workforce burnout, and financial sustainability, with many, but not all, expecting the coming months to be more difficult than last year. Despite these concerns, there are signs of cautious optimism, particularly in perceptions of care quality and confidence in delivering financial plans. See report.

NHS England published planning guidance over the course of October and November 2025. Integrated care boards (ICBs), and NHS trusts and foundation trusts (providers) must now work with this planning guidance to develop medium-term plans.
