<p>Play therapy – a psychodynamic-developmental perspective <i>Play therapy is a treatment modality for young children 2-7 whose development is disrupted by disturbances from internal or external conflict. This period includes major developmental advances, including semiotic capacity, theory of mind, complex relationships and emotions, especially ambivalence. By 7 or 8, the child has moved away from pretending and is oriented toward consensual reality. Playing pretend allows children to try on new roles, express difficult emotions in displacement and to figure out what they think and feel.
