## Artificial Intelligence (AI) resources - Claude



In the Sep-Oct 2023 newsletter we discussed the pros and cons of <a href="ChatGPT">ChatGPT</a>, an artificial intelligence (AI) chatbot or language model launched in November 2022. Another conversational AI assistant <a href="Claude">Claude</a> represents one of the most advanced chatbots available, with capabilities beyond many competitor platforms.

Claude offers a simple file uploading process, allowing users to attach up to 5 files at once by either clicking the attachment button or directly dragging and dropping files into the chat window. Supported file sizes go up to 10MB each, enabling users to submit substantial documents, images, and other media for Claude's multi-file processing.

The chatbot can process over 75,000 words at once, enabling analysis of long documents like transcripts, reports, and articles. It will then generate summaries or extract critical details to answer questions about the content.

With continuous training on up-to-date real-time data, Claude can provide users with informed answers about current events and topics in the news.
