Maternity services

The <u>HSSIB's exploratory review of maternity and neonatal services</u> highlights systemic issues in governance, risk recognition, and professional standards, identifying key areas for future investigation to support a forthcoming national inquiry into patient safety and care quality.

The NHS Digital Maternity and Neonatal Data Hub provides centralised access to a wide range of data, reports, and guidance on NHS-funded maternity services in England,









supporting analysis, service improvement, and informed decision-making

This <u>NHS England framework</u> outlines how genomics is revolutionising healthcare by enabling faster diagnoses and treatments, and sets out a three-year plan to build a genomically skilled nursing and midwifery workforce across all roles and practice areas.

The <u>NMC's Principles for Supporting Women's Choices in Maternity Care</u> aim to promote safer, person-centred care by guiding midwives and organisations in respecting and supporting informed decisions made by women, even when those choices fall outside standard care pathways.

The <u>revised Perinatal Quality Oversight Model (PQOM) from NHS England</u> offers a structured and consistent framework for monitoring perinatal services and gathering insights to support continuous improvement.

Workforce & education

NHS England is calling on registered nurses, midwives, nursing associates and students across England to help shape the Professional Strategy for Nursing and Midwifery in England. They are asked to share their views, experiences and ideas by completing this survey: Defining the next era of nursing and midwifery. The survey will close at midnight on Monday 29 September 2025.

The **Maternity and Neonatal Independent Senior Advocate (MNISA) role**, introduced across England, supports families affected by serious maternity incidents and aims to improve NHS care by ensuring their voices are heard. This <u>evaluation from the Nuffield Trust</u> assesses how the role has been implemented and its impact on families and the healthcare system.

The <u>UK government has launched a Graduate Guarantee</u> to ensure every newly qualified nurse and midwife in England has access to a job, unlocking thousands of new roles and supporting a smooth transition from training to employment as part of wider NHS workforce reforms.

Clinical placements are a cornerstone of health care education and workforce development. This guide from NHS Employers aims to provide employers with practical examples to help manage and diversify their placement capacity whilst providing an excellent student learning experiences. Evidence shows that students who have a good placement experience will normally apply for a position within that organisation or specialty at the end of their training.

Equality, diversity and inclusion

This <u>report from Five X More</u> captures the lived experiences of Black women across the UK who have been pregnant or given birth in the last four years. It explores the quality of care, communication with professionals, discrimination and what still needs to change. The report finds that Black women are still facing barriers and the system must do better.

Due to variations in systems used across NHS Trusts, booking referral forms and data collection in maternity and neonatal services sometimes don't reflect LGBTQIA+ experiences. This can affect the ability of midwives and healthcare professionals to provide personalised, inclusive care. In response, <u>LGBT Mummies have co-produced an LGBTQIA+ Inclusive Maternity Notes document</u>.

NHS England has launched an online self-referral form for maternity services. This will make it possible for newly pregnant women to refer themselves directly to local maternity services without seeing a GP first, and to arrange their first midwife appointments more quickly.

Labour & birth

NHS England has published national guidance on managing birth notifications following an unassisted birth. This new guidance supports statutory obligations under Section 269 of the NHS Act and introduces a centralised notification process to bring consistency and clarity across systems. An unassisted birth refers to instances where a woman consciously chooses to give birth without the support of a registered healthcare









professional - distinct from an unplanned 'born before arrival' birth.

Infant feeding

Quarterly and annual data sets from the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities about the number and proportion of infants who have been fully, partially or not at all breastfed at 6 to 8 weeks.

Specialist Pharmacy Service: <u>Using antipsychotics during breastfeeding.</u>

Quetiapine is the preferred second-generation, and haloperidol the preferred first-generation antipsychotic when breastfeeding full term, healthy infants.

Neonatal

Neonatal services

Data from the National Neonatal Audit Programme (NNAP) reveals a significant rise in the use of Deferred Cord Clamping (DCC) for preterm babies. This life-saving practice, known to reduce mortality by around 32%, was performed on 68.3% of babies born before 34 weeks in 2023, up from 60.4% in 2022. The NNAP has been crucial in identifying neonatal units with lower-than-average DCC rates, helping to boost adoption across the UK. Since 2020, when rates were below 29%, DCC use has steadily increased and is expected to exceed 70% in 2024.
